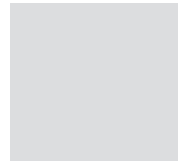

City meter readers read about 75,000 electric and water meters every month. Various obstructions, including locked gates, aggressive pets, or pets who try to escape fenced areas when the gate is open, can create barriers that keep readers from getting close enough to obtain an accurate reading.

City Municipal Code requires all customers to provide safe access to City metering equipment.

Customers who don't want a meter reader to enter their yard every month may have a meter installed that can be read remotely. This can be done for a minimal one-time cost that can be added to your utility bill with a monthly payment plan. Please call (303) 651-8386 to learn more or to schedule an appointment for installation.

CONNECTING YOUR SERVICE

If you are a new residential customer and you own or are purchasing your home, you can connect by phone or online. To connect online, go to Utilities from our home page at LongmontColorado.gov and click on "Start/Stop Service." To connect by phone, simply call 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

No deposit is required; just remember to allow two business days by phone or three business days online prior to the time you want service connected in your name. A connect fee will show on your bill.

If you are a new residential customer and DO NOT own or are NOT purchasing your home, you will need to pay a utility deposit and provide personal information. A satisfactory letter of credit from a prior electric company can be used in lieu of a deposit. A deposit also can be paid by using a debit card. A connect fee will show on your bill.

Regardless of which category you fall into, we will ask for personal information, such as place of employment, home and business phone numbers, driver's license and Social Security numbers, nearest relative and a local reference.

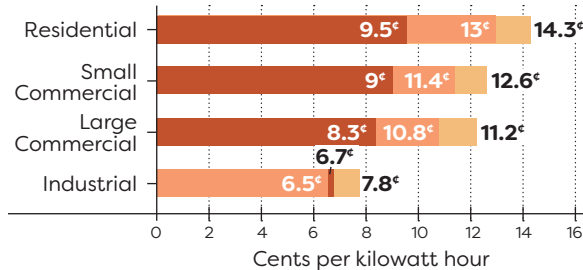

Trash, recycling and optional composting services are provided to all residential homes in Longmont. In addition to weekly trash collection, some of our services operate on every-other-week (EOW) schedules. **See your custom collection calendar, download the free mobile app and sign up for reminders plus service alerts at LongmontColorado.gov/WasteServices.**

- **ServiceWorks.LongmontColorado.gov offers 24/7 customer service.** Online services include changing your current collection services or adding new ones.
- **Containers must be placed at the curb earlier than 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day,** but should not be put out earlier than 4 p.m. the day before. They must be taken in no later than 8 p.m. the day following collection.
- **Containers should be placed a minimum of two feet from each other** and also from any parked vehicle or stationary object.
- **Don't overfill your carts** – all lids should properly close. Overfilling leads to spills during collection.
- **Single-stream Recycling:** plastics, glass, cardboard, paper, aluminum/steel cans and lids. Access our single-stream recycling guide and Waste Wizard tool at bit.ly/longmont-recycles.
- **Curbside Composting (subscription add-on):** yard waste, leaves and branches, food (including meat, dairy and bones), soiled and shredded paper. Learn about the service at bit.ly/locoforcompost.

DID YOU KNOW?

Waste Services collection vehicles are transitioning to run on clean, no-emission renewable natural gas (RNG) generated from biogas at our Wastewater Treatment Plant. To date, half of the fleet has been replaced with RNG-powered trucks. The remaining vehicles are projected to be replaced by 2024.

With more than 40 parks throughout Longmont, there's something for everyone.

Neighborhood parks provide close-to-home recreation activities with playgrounds, playing fields, sport courts, shelters, dog off-leash areas, and small wheels parks.

Community parks serve the larger community, providing space for athletic complexes and major recreation facilities such as pools and recreation centers.

Nature areas provide access to and enjoyment of important

natural, historic and cultural resources. Design of these areas is intended to promote low-impact, passive outdoor recreational opportunities that fit each spot's unique, natural characteristics.

Featuring an indoor gymnasium with a sport court floor, this facility offers basketball, volleyball, locker rooms, and a group fitness room. There is a fully stocked weight and cardio room. It is also the home of Itty Bitty City, preschool tumbling classes, and table tennis.

CENTENNIAL POOL:

This indoor heated pool has lap lanes, a wading area, and a deep end with two 1-meter diving boards. In addition, there is a fitness room with treadmills, Lifecycles, ellipticals, and a FreeMotion cable resistance weight machine.

A heated outdoor pool geared to ages 10 and younger. Features a zero-depth and chair lift entry, fun water slide, spray features, and a 4-foot deep end – great for jumping and swimming.

A heated outdoor pool geared to ages 8 and younger with a maximum depth of 2 feet 8 inches. Features zero-depth geysers, tumble buckets, water cannon, and spray garden.

SUNSET GOLF COURSE : 1900 Longs Peak Avenue | (303) 651-8466

Located in historic old Longmont, Sunset is one of the most scenic 9-hole courses in Colorado. A Colorado golf publication rated Sunset the best 9-hole course in the state. Sunset is known for its superb conditioning, tree-lined fairways, and spectacular views of Longs Peak.

TWIN PEAKS GOLF COURSE: 1200 Cornell Drive | (303) 651-8401

Twin Peaks is a traditional-style, Frank Hummel-designed championship course that features elevated greens and water hazards on seven holes. This par 70 layout is a favorite of area players because it is challenging and enjoyable for players of all ages and abilities.

UTE CREEK GOLF COURSE: 2000 Ute Creek Drive | (303) 774-4342

Designed by the world-renowned Robert Trent Jones II Group, this 18-hole championship course is a par 72 ranging in length from 5,509 to 7,167 yards. Ute Creek is one of only eight Robert Trent Jones II courses in Colorado and the only one on the northern Front Range.

Ute Creek’s unique features offer challenge and interest for players of all abilities. Five lakes, two streams and a generous natural rough provide an abundant wildlife habitat. Multi-level fairways lead to RTJ II’s signature greens. Five par 3 and five par 5 holes with three of each on the back nine make Ute Creek’s design unlike any other course in the area.

VANCE BRAND AIRPORT

Longmont's airport first took off on Oct. 28, 1945, after the City purchased 220 acres from Paul and Cole Kugel and dedicated the site. Since 1988, it has been known as Vance Brand Airport, named after a Longmont-native NASA astronaut who piloted the Apollo-Soyuz Test Project and commanded three Space Shuttle missions.

Today, Vance Brand Airport has 293 hangars, more than 300 based aircraft, and a major impact on the Longmont economy. A 2018 Colorado Department of Transportation study found the airport helped create 490 jobs in the community and more than \$68 million in business revenue. It's been used for flight training, firefighting (including joint wildfire exercises with the National Guard), aerial surveying,



corporate and charter flights, skydiving, and plenty of just-for-fun recreational flying. There's even an aviation-themed seasonal outdoor restaurant.

The airport has also been a base for many volunteer efforts and community services, including Angel Flight, Pilots N Paws, the Civil Air Patrol, Light Hawk Conservation Flying, and various emergency agencies.

With so much happening at Vance Brand, it's clear that Longmont's future isn't just looking up — it's soaring!

The permit process ensures that minimum safety standards are met and that construction meets local building and zoning requirements. Make sure you understand the building codes and local ordinances before proceeding with any improvement projects. If you have questions, contact the Building Services division, 385 Kimbark Street, (303) 651-8332.

A building permit is required any time there is new construction of or addition, alteration, repair or demolition to the main structure or accessory buildings on a lot or parcel. This includes accessory buildings such as detached garages.

- **New Building:** Dwellings, garages, detached storage sheds (120 or more square feet), carports, all commercial buildings, etc.
- **Additions:** Buildings, swimming pools, patios, sunrooms, decks
- **Alterations:** Re-roofing, drywall, insulating, converting a garage or sunroom to living space, basement finishing, re-siding, retaining walls more than 48 inches, fences, etc.
- **Appliances:** Fireplace or gas log installation, air conditioners and swamp coolers, hot tubs, water heaters, etc.
- **Repairs:** Any repairs involving structural members

BAD WEATHER

Without a doubt, the most effective way to learn about impending bad weather is the National Weather Service (NWS). The NWS, located in Boulder, provides weather, water and climate data, forecasts and warnings for the protection of life. This NWS center is monitored 24 hours a day, seven days a week providing up-to-the-minute tracking of weather within that area.

Public Safety highly recommends residents familiarize themselves with these resources and sign up for the notifications they provide on Facebook and Twitter or at Weather.gov.

We also recommend a weather radio and provide these to residents free of charge with a current Longmont utility bill or a driver's license with a Longmont address.



IF POLICE AND FIRE HAD TO REACH YOU IN AN EMERGENCY, COULD WE?

Anyone living within Longmont city limits who no longer has a landline phone in their home and wants to receive police and fire emergency notifications (known as reverse 9-1-1) must register.

If you own other communication devices, such as, cell phones, VoIP (voice over internet protocol), etc., you also should sign up for

this service as it provides a number of additional ways in which emergency information can be disseminated quickly.
