April is Parkinson's Awareness Month!

Parkinson's is a movement disorder that impairs balance and coordination, slows movement and leads to tremors and stiffness of the limbs. It is caused by degeneration of dopamine producing cells in specific parts of the brain. There are many medications and treatments available, but the one



thing proven to slow the progression of the disease is exercise.

Currently there are more than 1 million people in the U.S. diagnosed with Parkinson's and about 25,000 of those live in Colorado.

Parkinson Association of the Rockies (PAR) is an independent, local non-profit in Colorado whose mission is to connect and empower people with Parkinson's to thrive through educating, creating awareness, promoting research and supporting those with the disease, their families and the Colorado community.

PAR offers resources in Longmont including two support groups.

A general support group meets at 10 am on the 2nd Wednesday of the month and a Care Partner only support group at 11:30 am on the 1st Tuesday of the month at Longs Peak United Methodist Church, 1421 Elmhurst Drive in Longmont.

FOLLOW THE 'GROUND RULES' AND CALL BEFORE YOU DIG!

April's a popular time for digging into long-awaited outdoor projects, from minor landscaping work to major home improvements. But that work can turn dangerous fast if you don't know what's waiting underground.

That's why April is also National Safe Digging Month, with a simple reminder: Always contact 811 before you dig!

Colorado's "Call Before You Dig" law protects your utility lines from being cut during underground work, which also protects you and your neighborhood. Just remember:

- If you're going to dig on your property, or in a nearby easement or right-of-way, contact 811! This warns anyone who has an underground line in the area to mark it with paint or a flag, which is called "locating." You MUST contact 811 at least three business days in advance.
- If your electric meter is not attached to the house or if you
 have a pedestal light, you will need to hire a private locating
 company! It is your responsibility to call a private locating
 company and have that line marked before any work begins.
- These may not be your only private lines! Water, sewer, and storm sewer lines all have private components to them and will need to be privately located as well. If you have questions about this, please call 303-651-8416
- If you own an underground line in an easement or right-ofway, call 303-232-1991! This lets you register your line with the Utility Notification Center of Colorado so that anyone calling 811 knows your line is there. All lines in these areas must be registered. This costs \$25, plus a small charge for each notification.

If flags appear in your yard, please leave them there – they're keeping your lines safe. If the flags seem to have been out for a while, call 811 or 1-800-922-1987 to ask if it is safe to remove them.
