Take simple steps for better air this summer

A ir pollution impacts everyone in Longmont. Thankfully, there are many simple steps we can take to improve our air quality and reduce exposure to wildfire smoke and harmful air pollution.

The first step is to be "air aware" by knowing what the current air quality is like around you. This can help you avoid harmful outdoor air pollution, which you can't aways see, by staying inside or adjusting your schedule. Smartphone apps, like the EPA's free AirNow app, make checking the current local air quality a breeze. You can also text "BetterAirCO" to 21000 to sign up for ozone action text alerts.

The next step is to be wildfire ready. May is Wildfire Awareness Month in Boulder County, which means it's a

FLOODPLAIN BASICS

LongmontColorado.gov/flood-info: Find information about the flood insurance that is available for any property, regardless of whether it is located in a 100-year floodplain.

The City of Longmont can provide several kinds of floodplain information such as details on FEMA Flood Zones including the floodway, Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs), City Mapped Floodplains (e.g., Spring Gulch No. 2), Flood Insurance requirements, 2013 flooded areas, floodplain map updates, and copies of existing Elevation Certificates.

BoCo Alert in case of emergency

If police or fire had to reach you in an emergency, could we?

Anyone living within the city of Longmont limits who no longer has a landline in their home and uses a cellphone, VoIP (voice over Internet protocol), email instead, you will want to sign up for BoCo Alert as it provides a number of additional ways in which emergency information can be disseminated quickly.

When will the emergency notification system be used? The system in the Longmont city limits is activated by the Longmont Emergency Communications Center (LECC) and is used to notify residents about imminent threats to health and safety:

- Wildfire
- Hazardous spills
- At-risk missing child or adult
- Dangerous situations and individuals
- · Other emergencies

great time to review your evacuation routes and take action to reduce wildfire risk on your property. Wildfires can and do happen here, so it's important to be ready. Sign up for emergency alerts at boulderodm.gov and visit wildfirepartners.org for home preparedness guides and more.

Finally, we encourage you to take one action this summer to help us improve Longmont's air quality. It could be as simple as skipping two car trips each week, avoiding idling, or replacing a gas-powered lawn mower with an electric one (many retailers are now offering a 30 percent discount!). Meals on Wheels delivers!

Longmont Meals on Wheels is YOUR local nonprofit home-delivered meals program. The agency prepares meals daily and delivers them to the homes of older adults and people with disabilities in Longmont and Niwot.



Meals are offered on a sliding scale, so they are affordable for anyone. The menu is varied and published monthly, so people can either get meals every day or just the days they are interested in the offering. If you or someone you know is coming home from a hospital stay, outpatient or rehab center, they can also deliver five free meals to your home to help you after your hospitalization or procedure. This program is open to anyone in Longmont or Niwot.

Longmont Meals on Wheels also serves a community lunch at 11:30 am Monday-Friday at the Parkview Café at the Longmont Senior Center for residents 55 and older and their guests. This meal is very affordable and popular with a salad bar option Wednesday-Friday.
